

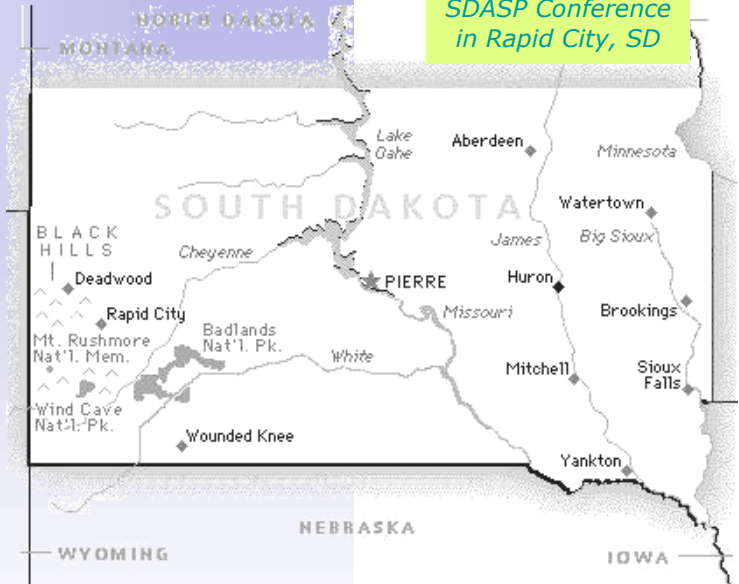

Fall Conference Speakers



Teri Hastings PhD, is a clinical psychologist with neuropsychological training, who specializes in child/adolescent assessment including needs for IEP diagnosis and treatment planning. She has worked at Regional Rehabilitation Institute at Rapid City Regional Hospital since 2010. Dr. Hastings is also part-time adjunct faculty at the Family Medicine Residency Clinic in Rapid City, SD, where she assesses and conducts brief therapy with pediatric patients.

She has 20 years of experience working with children in a variety of clinical settings.

Shelly Grinde, MA, CCC-SLP, is the Associate Director of Services at the Center for Disabilities. The Center for Disabilities is a division of the Department of Pediatrics at the Sanford School of Medicine of The University of South Dakota. Ms. Grinde has 19 years' experience working with individuals with speech and communication disorders, and currently consults with school district staff in the area of supporting students with brain injury in the classroom.

Jaime Nolan-Andrino is the Chief Diversity Officer and Director of the Office of Diversity, Equity and Community at South Dakota State University. Nolan-Andrino has been working in higher education in the areas of diversity, equity, and inclusion for more than 20 years and is very passionate about what she calls “the work” of our time.

Prior to coming to SDSU in July of 2012, Nolan-Andrino served as Director for Multicultural Affairs at UMass Lowell, Associate Dean for Diversity and Director of the Office of Undergraduate Studies at Colgate University and Special Assistant to the Vice President for Multicultural Affairs at the University of Minnesota.

Nolan-Andrino graduated from Washington State University with honors in American Studies and continued at Washington State where she also earned her Master's degree in American Studies. Both her undergraduate and graduate degrees centered on American Comparative Cultures.

She has taught courses in Women's Studies and Chicano Studies as well as in the University of Minnesota's Freshman Seminar Program where she co-developed and taught a course entitled “The Dynamics and Complexity of Identity in a Multicultural World.”

During her tenure at Colgate University she developed Breaking Bread, a program designed to create opportunities whereby working partnerships, alliances and networks across different cultures are developed. Breaking Bread has been implemented at several other colleges across the country.

Nolan-Andrino has developed and implemented diversity training programs, has provided mediation/conflict resolution, and has developed recruitment and retention initiatives at several universities.

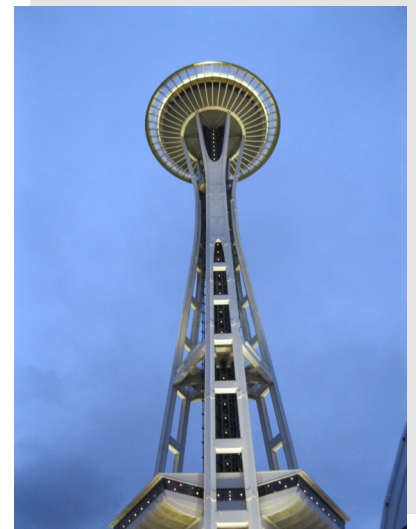
